“European Farmers’ Deal: EPP Vision for Agriculture in Europe”


15 April 2024, Rome, Italy

Background

In October 2023, the Presidency of the EPP Group approved the EPP Outreach activities on the “European Farmers’ Deal: EPP Vision for Agriculture in Europe”, which consist of targeted events in the Member States in order to further develop the dialogue with farmers and agricultural policy-makers across the EU.

The events are organised under the coordination of Siegfried MUREŞAN MEP, Chairman of the Working Group Budget and Structural Policies, Vangelis MEIMARAKIS MEP, Vice-Chair of the EPP Group responsible for the relations with the National Parliaments and CoR, Herbert DORFMANN MEP, EPP Group Coordinator for Agriculture and Rural Development, and with the respective Head(s) of EPP national delegations.

The third external event took place in Rome, Italy on 15 April 2024, bringing almost 200 leaders across all levels of governance as well as agricultural stakeholders across Italy and Europe.



Welcome

Salvatore DE MEO MEP, Member of the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development (AGRI), welcomed the attendees and highlighted the EPP's stand on European farming along with its initiatives in the European Parliament. He emphasized the connection between farming and environment, and expressed a commitment to addressing crucial questions and engaging directly with farmers during the conference.



Herbert DORFMANN MEP, Head of the Südtiroler Volkspartei Delegation in the EPP Group,
EPP Coordinator for Agriculture and Rural Development (AGRI), emphasized the significance of listening to farmers' perspectives and fostering active debate for a stronger Common Agricultural Policy and the farming sector. He expressed concern over top-down directives from former Commission Vice-President Timmermans and left-leaning parties and advocated for solutions rather than mandates. He highlighted the impact of global crises, stressing the need for food security and sovereignty. Observing a shift towards regional and pragmatic policies, he underscored the importance of sustainable and profitable farming, particularly for young farmers and in peripheral areas.



Introductory remarks

Siegfried MUREŞAN MEP, Vice-Chair of the EPP Group in the EP, Chairman of the Working Group for Budget and Structural Policies, in his introductory speech, highlighted the EPP's historical support for European farmers and agriculture. He stressed the EPP's efforts over the past five years to defend farmers and rural areas in the European Parliament, emphasizing the need for a realistic transition to a green economy. He underscored the importance of equal standards of living in rural areas and advocated for reducing bureaucracy to support farmers. Lastly, he emphasized the need to balance quality and quantity in food production and expressed solidarity with Ukraine, proposing measures to facilitate Ukrainian grain exports without disrupting the European market.



Panel I: Agriculture and the environment: two sides of the same coin

Herbert DORFMANN MEP, Head of the Südtiroler Volkspartei Delegation in the EPP Group,
EPP Coordinator for Agriculture and Rural Development (AGRI), moderator of this first panel,
emphasized the importance of female participation in farming considered by many as a traditionally male-dominated field, and highlighted the necessity of combining both environmental and economic factors to ensure long-term sustainability in agriculture.



Christine SCHNEIDER MEP, Member of the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development (AGRI), emphasized the significant challenges faced during the last legislative period, particularly the approach of the left and the green political groups towards nature protection. She argued against the notion of setting aside land and advocated for a balanced approach to nature restoration that includes forestry and farming, asserting that farmers are part of the solution, not the problem. She also advocated for revising the Natura 2000 legislation in the new legislative term to better align with the needs of farmers. She called for policies that work with farmers, focusing on economic prospects and providing incentives rather than imposing bans. Lastly, she noted a shift towards strategic dialogue with farmers to address past mistakes and reduce bureaucracy, expressing hope for continued support in the future.



Desirée DE LA CARIDAD NIEVES, Farm owner, highlighted the significance of listening to farmers and the important contribution of female farmers. She emphasized farmers' dedication to organic farming and ethical labour practices, rejecting the myth that farming harms the environment. She expressed farmers' desire to continue sustainably their work, stressing the importance of dispelling misconceptions about agriculture's environmental impact. She concluded by acknowledging the diversity of farming methods, and advocated for support systems that enable farmers to produce food for the population while competing globally.



Caterina RICCI, Farm owner, provided specifics about her farm as part of her family legacy, expressed pride in being part of the cooperative council. Cooperation is the way to advance and to tackle current challenges such as natural disasters that arise from climate change. She also emphasized the collective effort to enhance the value of the Italian agricultural sector through cooperation.



Herbert DORFMANN MEP, Head of the Südtiroler Volkspartei Delegation in the EPP Group, EPP Coordinator for Agriculture and Rural Development (AGRI), concluded the panel by emphasizing the significance of addressing sustainability expenses. He proposed a dual approach, suggesting that public founding, such as the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP), and partially through consumer contributions could cover a portion of these costs. Additionally, he underscored the crucial need to distribute value equitably along the food chain, emphasizing that consumers' payments should not bear the entire burden of costs.

Q&A - Panel I

The Q&A session with the audience led to a debate, as the attendees voiced their perspectives and concerns. The discussion covered several crucial topics, including access to banking and credit facilities, the integration of sustainability with productivity, the ramifications of imported lower-quality products, funding for organic farming, and the practice of beekeeping.

The panellists highlighting the importance of financial sustainability in agriculture and the need for research and innovation to tackle challenges like climate change. They emphasized the role of farmers as entrepreneurs and advocated for their recognition and support in achieving work-life balance. Consumer campaigns and storytelling were highlighted as tools to promote sustainable practices, alongside calls for impact assessments and early education initiatives. The panellists also discussed about practical challenges, including meeting retail demands for sustainability, with a focus on the importance of education to foster understanding of agricultural practices and sustainability principles.

The panel discussion highlighted the multifaceted nature of challenges facing agriculture and underscored the importance of collaborative efforts among policymakers, farmers, and consumers to ensure a sustainable future for farming.

Panel II: The future of Italian and European agriculture

Salvatore DE MEO MEP, Member of the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development (AGRI), moderator of the second panel, emphasized the alignment between Forza Italia and the EPP in considering farmers as allies, not adversaries. He highlighted the importance of justifying environmental sustainability in socio-economic terms, and expressed concern about the Common Agricultural Policy resources decline and the need to protect them from being diverted for other purposes. The EPP Group is the party of the European farmers and rural communities. EPP, as the largest European political family supported farmers in the past and we will continue to do so with sharp determination.



Sara PARALUPPI, Director, Coldiretti Lazio, emphasized the need to implement the Common Agricultural Policy due to challenges in recent years, including the pandemic, conflicts, and fluctuating production costs. She highlighted the importance of agriculture in ensuring food security and environmental protection, noting that farms are inherently sustainable due to their recycling practices. She stressed the necessity of balancing sustainability with production, advocating for a revision of the Common Agricultural Policy to prioritize both aspects. She called for simplified eco schemes and adjustments to regulations to accommodate different agricultural realities, particularly in regions like Italy where diverse landscapes require tailored approaches. She also emphasized the significance of animal husbandry, biodiversity preservation, and the need to support young farmers. Lastly, she highlighted the importance of reciprocity in trade agreements and the protection of regional food heritages through clear labelling and food education.



Colm MARKEY MEP, Member of the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development, highlighted the importance of flexibility in agricultural policy, stressing the need for practical knowledge to be at the forefront of EU decision-making, particularly within the AGRI Committee. He expressed concern about the declining number of farmers, stressing the imperative of attracting younger generations to agriculture to ensure the sustainability of the rural economy. He advocated for embracing future technologies while maintaining high European standards and simplifying legislation to enhance competitiveness. Lastly, he argued that the EPP is the only political group that truly comprehends the practical implications of agricultural policies on the ground, contrasting this with other groups that lack such understanding.



Raffaele NEVI, Member of the Italian Chamber of Deputies, Secretary of the Agriculture Committee, emphasized the need for both national and European approaches to farming. He stressed the importance of producing strategic raw materials to ensure food security, particularly in light of geopolitical tensions affecting global supply chains. He underscored that Forza Italia advocates for increased production and supports farmers in achieving this goal. He highlighted the importance of the agricultural-industrial sector as a whole, emphasizing the intertwining of the primary and industrial sectors. He advocated for natural technologies over GMOs and synthetic foods, aligning with a campaign to preserve the Mediterranean diet and promote natural food production.



Matteo BARTOLINI, Vice President, Cia - Agricoltori Italiani, highlighted the need to revise the Common Agricultural Policy in light of recent crises and long-standing difficulties in European agriculture, including the loss of 5 million farms in the last fifteen years. He criticized the adoption of multifunctional approaches by farms as a diversion from addressing the fundamental issue of fair pricing. He emphasized the importance of impact assessments to understand farmers' needs and called for more support for family-run farms, which constitute 96% of European farms. He questioned the disproportionate distribution of supermarket spending and stressed the role of family services in supporting rural areas. Lastly, he identified the budget as a significant challenge for the future and suggested a stronger European presence to address disparities and offer opportunities in underserved areas.



Francesco BATTISTONI, Member of the Italian Chamber of Deputies, Vice President of the Environment, Territory, and Public Works Committee, emphasized the symbiotic relationship between agriculture and the environment, asserting that farmers are the primary stewards of the environment. He advocated for strategic compromises between agriculture and environmental concerns, and highlighted the importance of increasing production of alternative energy sources and implementing measures to protect farmers from unfair practices. He called for cooperation between the Italian and European Parliaments to address agricultural challenges and emphasized the need to reduce bureaucratic hurdles and facilitate access to credit for farmers. Additionally, he stressed the importance of generational turnover in agriculture and promoted initiatives like the “Tourism in Roots” campaign to encourage young people to engage in farming activities.



Salvatore DE MEO MEP, Member of the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development (AGRI), concluded the second panel by emphasizing the significance of production and energy efficiency in enhancing competitiveness, stressing the need for increased awareness, and outlining the efforts undertaken by the EPP Group - fighting for an innovative agricultural policy supported by adequate financing, especially for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) and for innovative young farmers.

Q&A - Panel II

Questions from the audience ranged from the Common Agricultural Policy's future and funding to beekeeping. The panellists addressed these questions by offering diverse insights into the future direction of the Common Agricultural Policy. They emphasized flexibility and resilience in resource allocation, advocating for dynamic support for farmers, including beekeepers, and stressed the importance of verifying honey sold in Europe and supporting initiatives like carbon farming, while ensuring market support and budget protection for farmers.

Siegfried MUREŞAN MEP, Vice-Chair of the EPP Group in the EP, Chairman of the Working Group for Budget and Structural Policies, in his concluding remarks, emphasized the importance of reducing bureaucracy to enable farmers to focus on farming. He highlighted the opposition to proposals endangering farmers' interests and underscored the partnership between Forza Italia and the EPP, noting their crucial role in safeguarding agriculture, small and medium-sized enterprises, and shared values.



Special intervention

Antonio TAJANI, Deputy Prime-Minister of Italy, Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, President of Forza Italia, noted the importance of farming for economic growth and as a foundation of culture and values. He expressed gratitude to allies for their support in protecting farmers and stressed the need to harmonize industry and agriculture, recognizing farmers as nature's custodians in the battle against climate change. He advocated for policies that support quality farming, recognizing Italy's unique geographical constraints and agricultural expertise. He underscored the significance of exploring new export markets while safeguarding sea routes and addressing challenges such as water scarcity, and called for investment in research and technology to enhance agricultural resilience and competitiveness, both domestically and internationally. He emphasized the role of agricultural exports in Italy's economy and the need to counter unfair competition from other regions, and committed to collaborate with international partners to promote Italian products and defend the Mediterranean diet against misinformation. Lastly, he reaffirmed his commitment to working within the EPP to champion the interests of farmers and advance European values. He advocated for unity within the EPP ahead of elections, emphasizing the importance of a cohesive approach to safeguarding agricultural interests and promoting European values on the global stage.




